## The Sanctuary of our Lady of Lourdes



As a world-famous spiritual center, the **Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes** welcomes millions of pilgrims and visitors every year. In 1858, the Virgin Mary appeared 18 times to the young Bernadette Soubirous.

The Massabielle **Grotto** is central to the history of Lourdes and its Sanctuary. As the place where the Apparitions took place, it is a must for all pilgrims and visitors. Built in the second half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century and the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, the three basilicas of the Sanctuary are must-see sites. The **Basilica of the Immaculate Conception**, easily recognizable by its tall spire, has stained-glass windows depicting the events in Lourdes.

The **Rosary Basilica**, in the Romano-Byzantine style, is covered with 2 000 m<sup>2</sup> of exceptional mosaics. Lastly, the **underground Basilica of St. Pius X** impresses everyone with its unusually large dimensions and features various stained-glass images in the gemmail style.

#### At 9 pm, the candlelight procession

Every evening, from April to October, thousands of pilgrims gather to walk and sing, flaming torch in hand. Whether you take part or just watch, it is always touching to witness this "magic" moment that brings people together from the four corners of the world. It is impossible not to be swept away by the power and beauty of all these flames, whose light spreads far beyond the Sanctuary.



### The Bernadette's Path



#### A history path

Following in Bernadette's footsteps is a chance to discover the places that were familiar to her: the mill where she was born, the **Moulin de Boly**, the gloomy **Cachot**, a former dungeon where she lived with her family at the time of the Apparitions in 1858, the **Hospice** where she was educated by the Sisters of Nevers and where she took her First Communion, the **parish church** where you can still see the baptismal font used at her christening, the **old Presbytery** where she met Abbot Peyramale, and the Maison Paternelle, known as the **Moulin Lacadé**, was home to Bernadette's parents after the Apparitions.

This is a walking tour. You can start from the **Museum of St. Bernadette**, a museum telling the story of her life through objects that belonged to her. You can follow the itinerary on your own or accompanied by a cultural guide.

### The Pic du Jer Funicular



#### The best view over the Pyrenees from Lourdes!

The Pic du Jer, that overlooks the town, can be recognized by its big cross, which is lit up at night. You can reach it by taking a **hundred-year-old funicular**, which will take you to the top at an altitude of 1 000 meters in a few minutes; a very scenic journey... At the top, **a walking trail** will take you to the observatory, where you will find a **unique panoramic viewpoint** offering a 360° view of Lourdes and the peaks of the Pyrenees.



#### The Pic du Jer Caves

During a 40-minute visit, a guide will lead you through the 360 m. of tunnels featuring various concretions and chasms. You can also learn about the great faults which appeared when the Pyrenees were formed. On leaving the tunnel, the guide will tell you all about the surrounding landscape, rounding off what is sure to be a rewarding discovery of an underground world.

### The Fortified Castel and the Pyrenean Museum

At the heart of the castle's grounds, the Pyrenean Museum, founded in 1921 by Louis and Margalide Le Bondidier, presents rich collections that trace the history of the Pyrenees mountains.

A Moment of Escape with a View over the City During the visit, each visitor can enjoy an exceptional panorama of the city, the Sanctuary, and the Pyrenees. They can relax in the garden, a green and colorful haven adorned with sculptures and models of Pyrenean valley architectures.



### Lourdes Medals



A little-known treasure of the town, you have probably already seen one or been given one made there: a Lourdes medal! That is right, they are 100% made in the Pyrenees!

The company's name is "MAJOADO, Manufacture Joaillière d'Occitanie". It has been based in Lourdes since it was set up in 1946. It was founded and for a long time managed by locals. They are the ones working here every day, sometimes for generations in the same family.

Brass, aluminum, gold, silver, precious or more humble metals... many different metals pass through the expert hands and the machines in the workshop. Real skills have also developed with vitreous enamel, which is colored blue to symbolize the Virgin Mary. Here the work of the enameller is a true art. This is also why since 2020 the company has been listed as a "Living Heritage Company" in recognition of all the firm's achievements.

### Candles of the Sanctuary



To meet the ever-increasing demand from pilgrims, and especially to illuminate the Marian processions which began in 1871, La Ciergerie Lourdaise was created in 1928.

Since its creation, La Ciergerie Lourdaise has carried on an unique and ancestral know-how thanks to two manufacturing methods, soaking and molding. The wick maintained vertically on a frame is dipped several times into a bath of paraffin at a constant temperature until the sought-after size is obtained. This know-how has been transmitted from generation to generation within the Ciergerie.

It is thus its own unique school. The Lourdes candle is unique with its Marian blue base which reminds us of the Virgin's blue belt, but also in its appearance (drippings and texture). In 2010, they created the first biodegradable and compostable votive for the Sanctuary.

In 2024, La Ciergerie de Lourdes started to produce all the small candles intended for the Notre-Dame cathedral in Paris!

The adventure begins with an aerial walk along a course of nets, from tree to tree, from perched hut to perched hut. The whole experience is punctuated by discoveries and games involving the 5 senses...

In "accrobranche", the sensations are guaranteed for everyone aged 4 and over, in complete safety, thanks to the continuous lifeline system. The 20 courses are progressive in terms of height and difficulty, and offer an introduction to "accrobranche" and/or a challenge for the more athletic on the more challenging courses!

From the age of 6, come and navigate the river in the heart of the Vallée des Gaves, in rafting, mini-raft, canoe or kayak. Half a day of fun and excitement, at the pace of the rapids on the Gave de Pau.

Ranked among the 3 most beautiful parks and zoos in France!

Located in Argelès-Gazost, the **Pyrenees Animal Park** invites you to have an unforgettable experience. A travel through 14 hectares of nature enables every visitor to discover nearly **100 animal species including: marmots, otters, lynx, brown bears, gray wolves, vultures, ibexes or even red pandas, meerkats, gibbons and songbirds of the rainforests.** 

The visitor can have a lot of closeness and interaction with the animals. It is possible to feed marmots and have birds land on one's arms.

The park is doubly important given that many of the species here have either disappeared in the wild or are teetering on the brink of extinction – most notably the brown bear.

## Cycling Activities



The **Pyrenees** are an ideal playground in France for cycling (road, mountain and gravel bikes). In any season, whatever your activity and your sporting ability, enjoy yourself here at the heart of wide open spaces, natural and preserved sites.

#### **Road cycling**

Known worldwide by all cycling fans thanks to the Tour de France, this part of the Pyrenees concentrates many mythical passes and climbs: Tourmalet, Aspin, Aubisque, Soulor, Luz Ardiden, Hautacam... There are no less than 14 passes or climbs easily accessible from Lourdes.

#### Mountain biking and Gravel

There are sites for downhill enthusiasts: the Pic du Jer (Lourdes), which is world famous thanks to the UCI DH Mountain Bike World Cup.

You can also find many itineraries for mountain bike trips: in total, more than 1 000 km of tracks and trails to practice your passion.

## Madiran Wine Tasting



A small appellation of 1 400 hectares located along the border between the Pyrénées-Atlantiques, the Hautes-Pyrénées and the Gers. **The vine was introduced to Madiran by Benedictine monks in the 11**<sup>th</sup> **century.** 

In 1948, the modern history of Madiran wines began with the creation of the AOC (Controlled Origin Appellation).

In the 1980s, under the impetus of a few pioneers, the appellation began a shift towards the production of quality wines. From the 2000s onwards, the Madiran winegrowers asserted their expertise and had their moment of glory.

**Tannat**, the king grape variety from the Pyrenean foothills, is the basis of the identity and originality of Madiran wines. This rare grape variety now represents nearly 70% of the appellation's vineyards. It flourishes wonderfully on the unique and exceptional terroirs of the rolling hills of Madiran. The complementary grape varieties are Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon.

## Jurançon Wine Tasting



#### «Bî dou Rey, rey dous bîs» (King's wine, King of wines)

This pretty motto is written in capitals at the entrance of the city hall of Jurançon. The village is quite proud of the wine that carries its name. **Made famous by King Henri IV baptism**, the Jurançon white wine was served during big ceremonies of the Maison de France. Today it still can be found on the finest menus during national and international events.

More than 360 winegrowers produce Jurançon dry wine, but also sweet wines which create great bottles with complex aromas and great ageing potential.



#### Cave de Gan

During your visit, you will discover the backstage of the wine making process, by retracing with your guide the journey of a grape, from its arrival on the reception platform of the harvest to the bottling of the wine.

Throughout your tour, you will discover the press room, the fermentation tanks, the superb semi-buried ageing cellar and its exhibition of Gallo-Roman mosaics from the 4<sup>th</sup> century (found in the ruins of the Roman villa of Pont d'Oly located in the city of Jurançon). The visit obviously ends with wine tasting accompanied by local products.

#### **Clos Lapeyre**

### Pic du Midi



To make the most of your first day on top of the Pyrenees, leave Lourdes nice and early and head for Bagnères-de-Bigorre then La Mongie ski resort, the departure point to the Pic du Midi.

You will not forget the cable car ride to the top in a hurry! You ascend the 1 000 m. altitude in less than 20 minutes in one of the two cable-car cabins to the Pic du Midi panoramic observation terrace. The summit **museum** is worth visiting. And remember to book your place on the voyage among the stars in Europe's highest planetarium, opened in the Couple Baillaud, which holds an important place in France's scientific history. You can also relive the Pic du Midi observatory's history through augmented reality using an Histopad. For thrill seekers, come and live a dizzying experience with the «bridge in the sky». Lunch on a selection of local dishes at "Le 2 877" restaurant.

In the shadow of the Pic du Midi, at an altitude of 2 115 m., the Tourmalet pass is legendary. The Tour de France covers it every year and cycling enthusiasts from all over the world come here to tackle the ascent.

Become acquainted with a stone giant, Victor Hugo's «colossus of nature», listed as a **UNESCO World Heritage site:** the Cirque de Gavarnie. You can get up close and personal with this wonder, carved out by the glacier that created the valley here.



From the far end of the village of **Gavarnie**, you set off on a two-hour walk (round trip) to the foot of this mighty Cirque. Easy to start with, the route becomes more challenging towards the end, but your hard work is doubly rewarded by the sight that greets you at the foot of the **monumental waterfall** (Europe's biggest!). And if you are not up to walk, it is possible to get there on a donkey.

Back in the village, reward yourself with a drink on a sunny café terrace while admiring the view, then trot off to see the Church of St John the Baptist, a Historical Monument and Unesco World Heritage Site as part of the 'Routes of Santiago de Compostela'.



## Cauterets - Pont d'Espagne



Today you follow in the footsteps of French authors Georges Sand and Victor Hugo and other figures of 19<sup>th</sup> century Parisian society, to **Cauterets** and the famous **Pont d'Espagne**, in the heart of the **National Park of the Pyrenees**.

The **Pont d'Espagne**, 7 km from Cauterets, is a former pastoral route that enabled France to trade with Spain. As a gateway to the **National Park**, the bridge is now a starting point for rambling through forests, rivers, waterfalls, lakes and breath-taking scenery. There is a lovely walk up to the radiant **Lac de Gaube** at the foot of the mighty peak of **Vignemale**, the highest peak in the French Pyrenees. It is a stiff climb, but there is an easy way up via the gondola and the chairlift. Picnic by the lake or enjoy lunch at the lakeside restaurant in the beauty of the surrounding scenery.

Do not head back down the valley before taking a stroll through the village of **Cauterets** to admire the **Belle Époque** architecture of this spa resort, where taking the waters was the height of fashion in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Cauterets is also well-known for its **berlingots**: this artisanal confectionery is the essential delicacy of the small spa town.


